

Workshop title: Safeguarding in Action

- Aim:** To enable all those involved in frontline adult social care to play their part in safeguarding adults at risk
- Designed for:** Anyone working with adults at risk
- Objectives:** By the end of the workshop, participants will
- understand the principles of making safeguarding personal
 - recognise the signs of abuse and abusive situations and activities
 - know what to do if you have concerns about possible abuse
- Method:** This workshop will be participative, using practical examples and activities to help everyone relate the learning to their role in safeguarding adults at risk
- Length:** One day, 9.30 – 4.30
- Preparation:** Staff should discuss with their manager the relevance of the workshop objectives to them as well as follow up and debrief
- Follow-up:** Staff write an action plan to apply their learning to their own job; this should then be discussed with their manager so it can be supported into action
